- Press ▼/▲ repeatedly to browse until the desired entry displays.
- Press ⇒/OK, and then press ▼/▲ to select DELETE ALL.
- 4. Press ⇒/OK twice to confirm.

# Find handset

This feature helps you find all system handsets.

### CAUTIONS

- Do not <u>press and hold</u> for more than four seconds. It may lead to handset deregistration.
- If the handset displays To register
   HS... and ...see manual, refer to
   Frequent asked questions to register
   the handset back to the telephone
   base.

# To start paging

Press on the telephone base.

• All idle handsets ring and display **PAGING**.

### NOTE

• Paging tone continues on the other handset.

# To end paging

- Press again on the telephone base;
- Press , C/Ø, O the handset;
   or
- Place the handset in the handset base / charger.

### NOTE

Paging tone stops when paging stops.

# Use the phone menu

- Press ⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ until the screen displays the desired feature menu.
- Press ⇒/OK to select and enter the menu.
- To return to the previous menu, press
   C/⊗I on the phone.

### NOTES

- If the telephone number in the directory exceeds 12 digits, appears on the display instead of ⊃. Press ▼ to select ▶ to show the remaining numbers.
- You hear a double beep when you reach the beginning or end of the directory.

  - You hear a confirmation tone.

### Dial a caller ID log entry

- 2. When the desired entry displays, press 🔊 to dial.

### **Delete a caller ID entry**

- Press C/⊗ on the cordless handset to erase a digit.
- <u>Press and hold</u> C/⊗ to erase all digits.
- Press 1 to add a space.

# Retrieve voicemail

When you received a voicemail, the handset and the telephone base display **New voicemail** and/or <u>@</u>.

To retrieve, you typically dial an access number provided by your telephone service provider, and then enter a security code. Contact your telephone service provider for instructions on how to configure the voicemail settings and listen to messages.

### NOTE

• After you have listened to all new voicemail messages, the indicators on the screen turn off automatically.

# Answering system (CS2050 series only)

### Message playback

If you have new messages, the telephone plays only the new messages (oldest first). If there are no new messages, the telephone plays back all messages (oldest first).

When playback begins, you hear the total number of messages followed by the date and time of the message. After the last message, the telephone announces, "End of messages."

### NOTE

Make sure you Set date and time correctly.

- Press ⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANS. MACHINE, and then press ->/OK to select.
- 3. Press ▼/▲ to scroll to MSG PLAYBACK, and press ()/OK to select.
  - If there is no message, the the display shows TAM EMPTY and returns to previous menu option
  - If there is a message, the displays shows the date and time (10/21 11-05A), i.e. on October 21st and at 11:05 am.
  - Press OK to control the playback.

The first received message will play first, while the new voice message is indicated by a  $\bigstar$  icon. Once the message is played, it will be saved automatically and the  $\bigstar$ icon will disappear.

You can adjust the volume by  $\mathbf{\nabla}/\mathbf{A}$ .

### Control the playback

- Press ⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANS. MACHINE, and then press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼ / ▲ to scroll to MSG PLAYBACK, and press - (OK to select.)
- - You can also press the keys on your handset to control.
  - **STOP** (JKL 5) Message playback

stops and return to previous menu. FORWARD (106) -Play the next new messsage if available. PREVIOUS (114) -Play the current messsage from the beginning. DELETE (120) - Delete currently play message and continue to play the next message if available. If there is no more message, it will return to previous menu option.

### **Delete all messages**

If you want to delete all the old messages, you just:

- Press -⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANS.
   MACHINE, and then press ⇒/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to DELETE ALL, and press <sup>(\*)</sup>/OK.
  - The display shows **CONFIRM?**
- 4. Select and press <sup>→/OK</sup> to confirm, or
   <sup>1</sup> to return to previous menu option.

### **Record memo**

Regardless the answering machine is on or off, you can record memos as reminders for yourself.

- Press ->/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANS.
   MACHINE, and then press ⇒/OK to select.

- - Select and press ⇒/OK to stop and save the recording, or
  - Select and press C/® to stop the recording without saving and then to return to previous menu option.

# Turn on/ off the answering system

By default, your answering system is ON. You can select to turn on or off the system.

- Press ⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANS.
   MACHINE, and then press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to TAM ON/OFF, and press <sup>(\*)</sup>/OK.

- 5. Select **ON** and press **OK** to turn on the system, and the LED on the base will turn on and display the number of messages. The **TAM ON** icon is **ON** in idle.

Select **OFF** and press **OK** to turn off the system, and the LED on the base will display -- and the **TAM ON** icon disappear in idle.

Press <sup>1</sup> to return to previous menu option.

- Follow Set date and time and reach DATE FORMAT. Press - →/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to choose DD-MM-YY or MM-DD-YY format.
- 3. Press ⇒/OK to save.

### Set time format

- Follow Set date and time and reach TIME FORMAT. Press →/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to choose 12HR or 24HR format.
- 3. Press ⇒/OK to save.

### Set date

- Follow Set date and time and reach SET DATE. Press -⇒/OK to select.
- Use the dialing keys (0-9) to enter the date (DD), month (MM), and year (YY). Then, press ->/OK to save.

### Set time

- Follow Set date and time and reach SET TIME. Press - →/OK to select.
- 2. Use the dialing keys (**0-9**) to enter the hour (**HH**) and minute (**MM**).
- 3. Enter the time in 24HR format, and it will auto choose **AM** or **PM**.
- 4. Press ⇒/OK to save.
  - The screen returns to the previous menu.
  - You hear a confirmation tone.

# Ringer

### Set alarm on or off and alarm time

  - The screen displays SN00ZE, and press ↔/OK to select it.
- 7. Press  $\mathbf{\nabla}/\mathbf{\Delta}$  to choose **ON** or **OFF**.
  - The screen returns to the previous menu. You hear a confirmation tone.

### **Rename handset**

You can rename the handset for your easy reference with the base.

- Press ⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to choose HS SETTINGS, and then press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to choose **RENAME HS**, and then press - (OK to select.)
  - HANDSET \_ displays; \_ cursor flashes and you can rename the handset.

Press c/⊗ to delete and the keypad to enter.

The dial mode is preset to touch-tone dialing. If you have pulse (rotary) service, you need to change the dial mode to pulse dialing before using the telephone to make a call.

- 6. Re-enter the new PIN to double confirm.
- 7. Press ⇒/OK to save.

### ECO range and mode

You can select to save power consumption and provide some reduction in transmission power and range.

### Set ECO range

- Press ⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to choose BS SETTINGS, and then press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to choose ECO RANGE, and then press ⇒/OK to select.
- - FULL RANGE X is the default setting.

### NOTE

In half ECO range, the transmission range is halved.

### Turn on or off Full ECO

- Press ⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to choose BS SETTINGS, and then press ⇒/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to choose FULL ECO, and then press - (OK to select.)

  - Press c/⊗ to select ⊃ and return to previous menu.

# Register a handset

When your handset is deregistered from the telephone base, follow the steps below to register it back to the telephone base.

- 1. Remove the handset from the telephone base.
- Press ⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to choose REGISTRATION, and then press ∻/OK to select. There are 4 bases to choose from- optional for supporting multiple bases.
  - **BASE 1** X (by default)

# Set your built-in answering system

The answering system can record and store up to 99 messages. Each message can be up to three minutes in length. The total storage capacity for the outgoing message, messages and memos is approximately 15 minutes. The actual recording time depends on individual message characteristics.

Your answering system allows you to set your outgoing message, to save and delete messages, activate call screening, to set number of rings before pick up, and to access remotely.

### NOTE

• Make sure you **Set date and time** correctly.

### Set the answer mode

The answering system has two types of answer mode. One is **ANS & REC**, and the other one is **ANSWER ONLY**.

**ANS & REC** is the default setting, and it answers the calls and allows callers to leave a message. **ANSWER ONLY**, on the other hand, only answer the calls but it does not allow callers to leave any messages. It will prompt callers to call

back later.

- Press ⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANS.
   MACHINE, and then press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to TAM SETTINGS, and press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANSWER MODE, and press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to select ANS & REC or ANSWER ONLY.
- 6. Press ⇒/OK to confirm.

# Select the answering system language

- Press ⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANS.
   MACHINE, and then press ⇒/OK to select.
- Press ▼ / ▲ to scroll to TAM SETTINGS, and press - /OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to TAM LANGUAGE, and press ⇒/OK to select. Select from the following languages:
  - DEUTSCH;
  - FRANCAIS; and
  - ENGLISH.

### Default outgoing message

The telephone is preset with a greeting that answers calls with "Hello, please leave a message after the tone." You can use this preset outgoing message, or replace it with your own.

# Record your own outgoing message

- Press ⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANS. MACHINE, and then press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to TAM SETTINGS, and press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼ / ▲ to scroll to OGM SETTINGS, and press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANS & REC or ANSWER ONLY, and press ⇒/OK to select.
- 6. Press ▼/▲ to scroll to **RECORD MESS**, and press ∻/OK to select.
- 7. During **RECORDING**, select and press **OK** to stop and save the recording and return to previous menu option.
  - Select and press C/⊗I to stop the recording without saving and return to previous menu option.
  - Maximum recording length is 3 minutes.

# Play and delete your outgoing message

- Press ⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANS. MACHINE, and then press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to TAM SETTINGS, and press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to OGM SETTINGS, and press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANS & REC or ANSWER ONLY, and press →/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to PLAYBACK, and press ->/OK to select.
- 7. During **PLAYING**, select **OK** to stop the outgoing message playback and return to previous menu option.
  - Select C to delete your outgoing message and return to previous menu option.
  - Default outgoing message cannot be deleted.

### NOTE

 After you deleted your own recorded outgoing message, the answering system answers calls with the default outgoing message

### **Options during playback**

- Press ▼/▲ on the cordless handset to adjust the listening volume.
- Press to switch between the speakerphone and handset earpiece.

### Set answer delay

Use this feature to set the number of rings for the answering system pick up the incoming call.

- Press ⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANS. MACHINE, and then press ⇒/OK to select.
- Press ▼ / ▲ to scroll to TAM SETTINGS, and press - (OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANSWER
   DELAY, and press ->/OK to select.
- 5. Press ▼/▲ to select between TIME SAVER, 2 RINGS, 4 RINGS, 6 RINGS, or 8 RINGS. Press →/OK to save the settings and return to previous menu option.
  - Press <sup>1</sup> to return to previous menu option without changing and saving.

### Set record time

Use this feature to set the message recording time.

- Press ⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANS.
   MACHINE, and then press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼ / ▲ to scroll to TAM SETTINGS, and press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to RECORD TIME, and press ->/OK to select.
- 5. Press ▼/▲ to select between 60S, 120S, 180S, or UNLIMITED.
  - Select and press OK to save the settings and back to previous menu option.
  - Select <sup>1</sup> to return to previous menu option without changing and saving.

# Turn on or off the call screening

Use this feature to choose whether incoming messages can be heard while they are being recorded.

- Press ⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANS. MACHINE then press ⇒/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to TAM SETTINGS then press ⇒/OK to select.
- 4. Press  $\nabla / \blacktriangle$  to scroll to **BS SCREENING**.

- 5. Press  $\mathbf{\nabla}/\mathbf{\Delta}$  to choose **ON** or **OFF**.
- 6. Press ⇒/OK to save.
  - You hear a confirmation tone.

### Turn on/ off remote access

You can turn on or off the remote access feature to access your messages.

- Press -⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANS. MACHINE, and then press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to TAM SETTINGS, and then press ->/OK to select.
- 4. Press ▼/▲ to scroll to **REMOTE ACC.**, and then press ->/OK to select.
- 5. Press  $\mathbf{\nabla}/\mathbf{\Delta}$  to select **ON** or **OFF**.
- 6. Select and press  $\Rightarrow$ /OK to save.
  - You hear a confirmation tone.

# Change the remote access PIN

You can set your own remote access code. Default PIN is **0000**.

- Press ⇒/OK when the phone is not in use.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to ANS. MACHINE, and then press ->/OK to select.
- Press ▼/▲ to scroll to TAM SETTINGS, and then press ->/OK to select.
- 4. Press ▼/▲ to scroll to CHANGE PIN, and then press ->/OK to select.
  - The display shows OLD PIN?----
  - Default PIN is **0000**.

- 5. Enter your current 4-digit remote access PIN.
  - The PIN is masked as XXXX.
- 6. Press  $\Rightarrow$ /OK to enter or C/ $\otimes$  to cancel.
  - If you entered the correct current remote access PIN, the display shows NEW PIN?----; - - - cursor flashes.
- 7. Enter your preferred 4-digit new PIN.
  - The PIN is masked as XXXX.
  - The PIN must be 4-digit, otherwise, it will not proceed to confirmation page.
- Re-enter the new PIN in confirm page.
   Press ⇒/OK to save and confirm.
  - You hear a confirmation tone.

# General product care

### Taking care of your telephone

Your cordless telephone contains sophisticated electronic parts, so it must be treated with care.

#### Avoid rough treatment

Place the handset down gently. Save the original packing materials to protect your telephone if you ever need to ship it.

#### Avoid water

Your telephone can be damaged if it gets wet. Do not use the handset outdoors in the rain, or handle it with wet hands. Do not install the telephone base near a sink, bathtub or shower.

#### **Electrical storms**

Electrical storms can sometimes cause power surges harmful to electronic equipment. For your own safety, take caution when using electrical appliances during storms.

#### **Cleaning your telephone**

Your telephone has a durable plastic casing that should retain its luster for many years. Clean it only with a dry nonabrasive cloth. Do not use dampened cloth or cleaning solvents of any kind.

#### Storage

When you are not going to use the telephone for some time, unplug the adapter(s), and remove the rechargeable battery from the handset. Store the telephone base, the handset, the charger(s) and the adapter(s) in a cool and dry place.

My telephone does not work at all.	Make sure the telephone base is installed properly, and battery is installed and charged correctly. For optimum daily performance, return the handset to the telephone base after use.
The display shows No line. I cannot hear the dial tone.	Disconnect the telephone line cord from your telephone and connect it to another telephone. If there is no dial tone on that other telephone either, then the telephone line cord may be defective. Try installing a new telephone line cord. If changing the telephone line cord does not help, the wall jack (or the wiring to this wall jack) may be defective. Contact your telephone service provider.
	You may be using a new cable or VoIP service, the existing telephone jacks in your home may no longer work. Contact your service provider for solutions.
l cannot dial out.	Make sure there is a dial tone before dialing. It is normal if the handset takes a second or two to synchronize with the telephone base before producing a dial tone. Wait an extra second before dialing.
	Eliminate any background noise. Mute the handset before dialing, or dial from another room in your home with less background noise.
